Finns are considered quiet and reserved, which is partly true. Small talk can hardly be seen as their strongest suit. But get on closer terms with a Finn and you'll find a warm, sincere and hospitable person underneath the seemingly cool shell.

Finns are hard-working and dutiful, but come celebration day, these people will show you the meaning of a good time. Prepare for sarcasm, though, as a Finn might tell you tall tales without ever cracking a smile.











Although known for advancements in technology and progressive urban solutions, most Finns stay close to Mother Nature. With almost 200 000 lakes and half a million summer cottages in the country, there's lots of hideouts for relaxation and outdoor activities.

Hiking, Nordic walking and cross-country skiing are considered fun over here. Some Finns prefer mountain sports, ice hockey, riding snowmobiles or rally driving.

BEFORE YOU GET ON THE ROAD

Traffic and driving

Right-hand traffic, no road tolls. Headlights must be used at all times. Snow tires are obligatory from December to February.

Seat Belts must always be used.

Speed limits



Unless otherwise indicated by a traffic sign, the speed limit is usually

Inside built-up areas Outside build-up areas: Motorways: 50 km/h 80 km/h up to 120 km/h

Please do pay attention to weather conditions and limit your speed accordingly!

Parking

A vehicle may be stopped or parked only on the right hand side of a road (except on a one way road).



Parking is prohibited:

-on a pavement, pedestrian crossing and within five meters before a pedestrian crossing -at an intersection and within five meters from its nearest edge -without paying a parking fee in a parking lot or area where a fee is set -without indicated by traffic sign



Traffic lights: No right turn allowed on red.

Drinking and driving

Don't drink and drive. The legal limit is $0,5 \, ^{\circ}/_{\circ\circ}$ of alcohol in blood.

Winter tyres

All Hertz cars are fitted with winter tyres when weather or road conditions so require.

DRIVER LICENCES

At the time of rental the driver must present a full valid national driver's licence, which has been held for at least 1 year.

The person named on the reservation booking must be the main driver, present at the time of rental and payer of any rental charges.

Additional drivers are possible with a fee of EUR 29,50 (including tax) per rental and per additional driver.

NEVERLOST are available for hire at an additional amount of EUR 17,36 (including tax) per day or EUR 80,60 (including tax) per week.



The **GRACE PERIOD** is 29 minutes, an additional day is applicable after 29 minutes over the 24 hour rental period.



PAYMENT

A credit card must be provided at time of pick up, which must be in the renters name and must have sufficient funds to cover cost of hire and fuel.



HERTZ RATES DO NOT INCLUDE FUEL

All Hertz vehicles are rented with a full tank of fuel and must be returned with a full tank or a local refueling charge will apply in addition to the cost of the fuel.



FUEL PURCHASE OPTION (FPO)

For the renters convenience it is possible to purchase a tank of fuel from Hertz at time of rental at a price that is competitive with local fuel stations. This method eliminates the need for the client to refill the tank before retuning. It is important to note that clients will not receive a refund for unused fuel.

BORDER CROSSING

Cross border traffic into the Nordic countries is allowed without special permission but client must inform Hertz at time of rental.

Driving into other European countries on request only.

Driving into Russia is not allowed.






WINTER SEASON
