Self-drive Tips

The UAE boasts an impressive network of first-class roads that connect major towns and villages, including multi-lane highways between Dubai, Abu Dhabi and Sharjah. You may need to pay toll on certain routes in Dubai. Hence, ensure you have a Salik tag. It is also highly recommended that you request for a GPS navigation system.

Driving Licence

You will require an International Driving Permit (IDP)

Road Rules

Driving in the UAE is on the right-hand side. Speed limits are clearly displayed on road signs and are usually 60-80km/h around town and 100-120km/h elsewhere.
