Self-drive Tips

Britain is made up of 4 countries, England, Scotland, Northern Ireland and Wales.

Driving is on left side of the road as opposed to the rest of Europe.

Take note if you plan to drive to France from the UK via the Eurotunnel.

There is a congestion charge in London between 7 am to 6 pm on Mondays to Fridays. Parking is not allowed along roads with red and yellow lines except single yellow lines where parking is restricted.

The speed limit on motorways is 112 kilometres per hour (km/h) and 48km/h in built-up areas.
