THE GREATSWISSROAD TRIP

The freedom of driving around in Switzerland, when travelling crosscountry, especially on a holiday is an advantage that cannot be compared to public transportation.

rom quaint alpine villages, scenic lakes, mountain peaks with panoramic views to beautiful cities, chateaux and castles, you can experience them all in any self-drive trip in the country.

Grand Tour of Switzerland is being introduced in April 2015 and is a nationwide tourist circuit spanning about 2,000 km including access routes. The trip includes numerous sightseeing opportunities and gives access to iconic beauty spots for excursions along a route that leads through the most beautiful parts of Switzerland. It covers cities, popular destinations and attractions like Zürich, Geneva, Davos, St Moritz, Ticino, Lugano, Jungfrau, Lucerne, Zermatt, and is an epic self-drive trip. Travellers on the Grand Tour circuit will have numerous sightseeing opportunities and access to iconic spots for excursions along a route that covers five Alpine passes, 22 lakes and 13 UNESCO highlights.

Zürich

Located at the North Western tip of Lake Zürich, Zürich - the starting point of this drive, is the largest city in Switzerland. The cobbled alleyways of the old town are great to wander around and the Quays along the banks of the Lake are enhanced by magnificently kept gardens. One can stroll along the Bahnhofstrasse, to indulge in the plethora of fashionable shops and restaurants. Zürich and the surrounding region are home to the biggest number of museums and exhibitions in Switzerland - the city offers a wealth of history, architecture, and culture, and is an absolutely charming, interesting and beautiful place to visit.

Zürich to Bad Ragaz

Set against a gorgeous backdrop of mountains and lakes, the drive from Zürich to Bad Ragaz along the Highway A3, is beautiful. Switzerland offers the most scenic views of the contours of attractive mountain ranges of the Alps. Bad Ragaz, attractively situated in the



Rhine Valley at the mouth of the Tamina Gorge, is the home of a famous natural spring and is known as the ultimate spa resort in Switzerland. Moving around Bad Ragaz, on the left bank of the Tamina, stands the parish church of St. Pancras with 18th Century ceiling paintings. A short distance away to the North West of Bad Ragaz, is the little town of Sargans, where the 19th Century Town Hall (Gallatihaus) built in Classical style is worth seeing. Some of the other surrounding attractions include, Bad Pfäfers-in this baroque building, the history of the spa is outlined from 1630 to the present.

Bad Ragaz to Lugano (via Bellinzona)

En route to Lugano from Bad Ragaz, drive into Switzerland's Italian speaking canton - Ticino. The first stop is at the town of Bellinzona, which is famous for its three castles, Castlegrande, Montebello and Sasso Corbaro. A walk around this beautiful old town takes one back in time. The drive from here continues through the mountains. Flanked by mountains on either side, Lugano has a strong Italian flavor, both in their cuisine and architecture.



Lugano to Grindelwald to Interlaken (via Jungfrau)

Next morning enjoy an excursion to Swiss Miniature, before proceeding towards Grindelwald. At Grindelwald, depending on the season, you can choose to engage in winter sports or go hiking and swimming. Start your day with a trip to Jungfrau, which is one of the main summits of the Bernese Alps and is one of the main attractions for hiking. If you want to enjoy the rail network of Switzerland, you can leave your car at the hotel and use the modern coawheel up to Klein Scheideaa. From there the Jungfrau Railway climbs to the Eiger Glacier Station arriving at Jungfrau. Alternatively, a 15 minute drive will take you from Grindelwald to Lauterbrunnen (which offers a parking space) and from there you can take the train to Jungfrau. After having your fill of mind blowing vistas, you can drive



down to Interlaken. Located at 570m above sea level, Interlaken is one of the oldest tourist resorts in Switzerland and one of the most popular. It offers winter sports lovers access to some of the most spectacular skiing in the Alps, in an idyllic lakeside setting between the lakes Thun and Brienz. Stay at Interlaken and you could enjoy a variety of water-based activities throughout the year.

Interlaken to Montreux to Bern (via Laussane & Geneva)

Drive on to Montreux, possibly the most beautiful town on the banks of Lake Geneva. While there, enjoy a visit to the Chateau Chillon, a thousand-yearold castle, and the medieval town of Gruyeres, famous for its cheese. Stay overnight at Montreux. From Montreux you can chose to embark on a full day excursion to Glacier 3.000. Next destination on the route is Lausanne, surrounded by vineyards with Lake Geneva at its feet it is one of Switzerland's most beautiful cities. Drive around the lake to Geneva and see famous landmarks - Jet d'Eau whose Accommodation white plum marks the city from far. The lake itself is a memorable sight.

Bern to Basel to Zürich

Leave Geneva for yet another charming city of Switzerland and its capital, Bern. The city has plenty of interesting sights and things to do. Leave Bern in the morning and drive North to Solothurn. At the foot of the Jura mountains, Solothurn offers a rewarding three hours of exploration, as you visit the Old Town on the left bank. Continue to drive north into Basel and make a visit to Basel's two main attractions that include the Zoologischer Garden (Zoo) and Foundation Beyeler (Art museum). Stay overnight at Basel. Travel back to Zürich and relax before celebrating the end of a great drive by exploring the nightlife at the Old Town on the left bank of the River Limmat, with many bars and cafes tucked away on the side streets.

SOUTH GERMANY ROAD TRIP

Driving in Germany can be a great experience as the roads are well maintained and there are many scenic routes. Driving is also convenient with easy-tounderstand signs, easy-to-use GPS and with some of the most courteous and disciplined traffic in the world.

ermany's landscape is like from the fairy tales: castles, deep dark forests and mythical rivers. It is extraordinarily diverse, with cities, small towns, a wealth of art and culture, and pleasures of fine wine and beer. A fine way to discover Southern Germany is to do a self-drive from Munich, the capital of Bavaria, to Frankfurt, in Hessen. Set aside nine days for an invigorating drive past splendid scenery, dazzling monuments, charming countryside and stay in cosy guest houses, hotels or simply at family-run gasthofs and indulge in local cuisine & drink.

Munich

Munich has one of the best views of the Alps in clear weather and is home to Europe's finest airport. Visit the Old Town of Munich, best explored on foot, with stops to Frauenkirche (Cathedral Church of Our Lady), Alte Pinakothek (Art Museum housing famous collections of Old Master Paintings) and the Residenz (former royal palace) in the central part of Munich. Marienplatz (Our Lady's Square) is dominated by the New City Hall (Neues Rathaus) on the north side. The Glockenspiel in the tower of the new city hall draws millions of tourists a year. The east side, dominated by the Old City Hall (Altes Rathaus) has a newly reconstructed Gothic Council Hall and tower. The pedestrian zone between Karlsplatz and Marienplatz is a densely crowded area filled with international tourists and locals who frequent countless shops and restaurants in the area. A large public garden, English Garden, dominates the city centre and stretches to the northeastern city limits. Drawing 1.5 million visitors a year, visit the world's largest museum of science & technology, a Deutsches Museum. Your sightseeing

is completed with a visit to the BMW Welt (World) - known for its automobile museum. If local beers, cuisine and tradition are your preferences, go to the Augustiner Biergarten (Augustine Beer Garden), where on a hot summer evening, visitors fill the open air garden.

Munich to Feussen

The scenic drive from Munich to Fuessen takes less than two hours. Visit Linderhof Castle, the smallest of the three palaces built by King Ludwig II. Strikingly beautiful, the castle boasts of the hall of mirrors, tapestry chambers, bed chamber and a spectacular garden done in a historical garden design. Next, spend half a day to visit one of Germany's most famous landmarks - Neuschwanstein Castle. With over 50 million visitors since it was opened to the public, it was constructed on the top of a rugged hill above the village of Hohenschwangau in the nineteenth century and is renowned for its magnificent visual beauty as well as its interior. Lastly, visit Hohenschwangau Castle - the childhood residence of King Ludwig II, completing the trilogy of palaces used by Ludwig II.

Feussen to Meersburg (Lake Constance)

Continuing towards the west, the drive from Fuessen to Meersburg goes past Lindau and takes less than two hours. While hills and mountains dominate southern Bavaria, the Lake of Constance (the third largest lake in Europe) offers breathtaking scenery and is filled with picnickers, as well as water sport lovers. The quiet town of Meersburg is home to two castles, the Old Castle and the New Castle. Drive past vineyards overlooking the Lake of Constance, visit the open air archaeological museum built on stilts

baroque pilgrim church at Birnau.

Meersburg to Europa Park

Voted the finest amusement park in the world in 2014. Europa Park is best visited by car. Depart Meersburg for Donaueschingen where you can stop to have a look at the source of the River Danube. Located in the Black Forest at the confluence of rivers Brigach and Breg, the Danube pass through four capital cities before emptying into the Black Sea via the Danube Delta in Romania and Ukraine. Travel west towards Freiburg, while enjoy the surreal landscape of the Black Forest. Take a break at Lake Titisee in the Black Forest. Indulge in a boat ride, taste an original Black Forest Cake, shop for handmade

Cuckoo Clocks before proceeding to Rust where Europe Park is located. Over 100 attractions and international shows offer fun and entertainment for the



Europa Park to Baden Baden

An enchanting two hour drive brings you to the picturesque and well maintained spa town, Baden Baden located at the northern foothills of the Black Forest and in close proximity to the French border. Known for wellness spas, the thermal waters containing salt and rich minerals flowing from deep springs have therapeutic value and a soothing effect on the body. Which better place to experience the same than at the Caracella Spa (outdoor pool) and Friedrichshbad (indoor pool- full Monty compulsory). Evenings can be spent at fine dining restaurants at Lichtenter Allee, followed by a visit to Germany's only Casino - the Baden Baden Casino.

Baden Baden

Subject to clear weather, take a hot air balloon ride over outstanding scenery. Go for a scenic drive to Rebland - Baden Baden's wine growing district. Evenings are best spent taking the funicular ride to Mount Mercure. Enjoy para-gliding from the Mountain Top.



whole family on an area of 95 hectares.

Baden Baden to Frankfurt via Stuttgart

It's a circuitous route, but well worth the effort for car lovers. The drive from Baden Baden to Stuttgart takes little more than an hour. The capital city of Baden Wurttemberg, Stuttgart is renowned for its car museums - Mercedes and Porsche. Europe's most famous zoological garden - Wilhelma, Castle Square (SchlossPlatz), and its pedestrian zone with shopping outlets & international cuisine are also well worth visiting. Depart for Frankfurt in the evening and arrive after two hours.

UNITED KINGDOM SCENIC ENGLAND

Embrace the scenic driving experience of England.

drive in Britain can be a memorable experience as you can drive through the villages. around estates, past farms and terraces. take the main highways and roads in Scotland, Wales and the wondrous climes of the Lake District.

This is a circular route from the city of Exeter (about 3 hours drive from London), covering the English counties of Devon and Cornwall. It is a journey that presents the contrasts of England's Atlantic rugged windswept coast (driving the North Atlantic Highway A39) to the calmer Channel coast showcasing Cornwall's beautiful gardens and the vast barren moors of Devon.

Exeter - Woolacombe llfracombe

From Exeter, drive North-West towards the North Devon coastal town of Woolacombe (driving time 1 hour 45 minutes). The town is famous for the Woolacombe bay renowned as a surfer's paradise. The view on to the bay as the car descends in towards the town is especially beautiful.

From Woolacombe, drive for 15 minutes to Ilfracombe. It is a pleasant seaside town with a promenade lined with shops and restaurants, gardens and great views from the seaside Capstone Hill. It is laced with history as represented in its grand Victorian buildings and the old working harbour.

Ilfracombe - Exmoor -Barnstaple - Bude

From Ilfracombe, veer towards the East to Exmoor before continuing the South-Westerly journey along the Atlantic coast. Exmoor National Park contains a unique variety of landscape of moorland, woodland, valleys and farmland. The National Park's main town and service centre is Lynton (drive time from Ilfracombe: 35 min.) which has plenty of car parking. From here it's possible to take the exciting cliff railway to Lynmouth, which is one of the most popular destinations in the National Park.

From Exmoor, drive towards Barnstaple (drive time from Lynton: 40 min.), which is the oldest borough in the country and is the commercial and agricultural centre of North Devon. Stop to browse through the historic Pannier Market which offers fresh local produce, handmade arts and crafts and a range of antiques and collectables.

Carry on towards Bude (drive time from Barnstaple: 1 hour) which has been recorded as the sunniest place in the UK. It is a laidback area removed of any hustle bustle of larger seaside towns, and offers plenty of accommodation and restaurants. There is also a beautiful tidal swimming pool on the beach, perfect for enjoying a warm summer evening watching the sun going down. The Bude cluster consists of several villages such

as Kilkhampton with its large church and castle, and the pretty hamlet of Launcells, both of which can be worth exploring. If you prefer cliffs, you could make a stop instead at the cliffclinging village of Clovelly, around two athirds of the way from Barnstaple to Bude. The unique point of the village is that the cars get parked outside, and donkeys and sledges are the only form of transport along its cobbled ways.

Bude - Boscastle -Tintangel - Padstow -Newguay

Just south of Bude lies the renowned and attractive National Trust village of Boscastle with its spectacular cliffhung harbour entrance. Its Museum of Witchcraft is a very popular attraction and well worth a visit. Boscastle is the ideal place to have a leisurely morning stroll down to the harbour and quay area admiring the village's unique rugged atmosphere. Another 10 min. drive down the road is the village of Tintangel, famous for its castle ruins and dramatic sea views. The Tintangel Old Post Office is a 1300s building which contains Victorian artifacts which give an insight into the lives of the people in this area in the bygone eras.

For a late lunch, head towards Padstow (driving time from Tintangel: 45 min.), a typical Cornish fishing port home to the famous Seafood restaurant run by Rick

Stein, situated at the beautiful harbour. From Padstow we carry on to Newquay (driving time: 35 min.), the major town in this area. The Blue Reef Aquarium containing a giant ocean display with an underwater tunnel and the Zoo are both quite impressive attractions here.

The Towan beach in the centre of Newguay is big and bustling, and so is the harbour where there are many boat excursions.

Newquay - The Lost Gardens of Heligan -Mavagissey - Fowey

From Newquay, cut away South-East from the rugged Atlantic coast towards the more sheltered coves of the channel coast. The first stop is the Lost Gardens of Heligan (driving time from Newguay: 45 min.) located just inland off the coastal villages of Pentewan and Mevagissey. Cornwall has some of the best gardens in the UK and the one at Heligan is one of the best. In 2008 The Lost Gardens of Heligan was granted National Collection Holder status by Plant Heritage for its historic and unique collection.



There is lots to explore and a picnic lunch is possible at Heligan. Another option for a late lunch can be the quiet coastal fishing village of Meyagissey. which is a guick 10 min. drive away, and has loads of seafood options and places serving traditional Cornish fare. From Mevagissey, we drive to another beautiful seaside town of Fowey (driving time 35 min.) up along the channel coast. It is located on the estuary of the river Fowey and has lovely shops and galleries dotting the centre of the town along with cafes serving Cornish cream teas and authentic fish and chips.



If you are up for more than just a little stroll in town, a highly recommended dramatic cliff-side coastal trail takes you all the way from Fowey to the tiny village of Polkerris by the sea, and to the charming village of Tywardreath. The trail is clearly marked, and can take up to three hours, especially if you take a few breaks to enjoy the view. The views of the calm sea from the cliffs are dramatic and wonderful.

Fowey - Eden Project -**Datmoor National** Park - Exeter

From Fowey, we set off towards the Eden Project, about a 20 min drive away. Set in a huge meteor crater, the extremely impressive conservationist attraction is home to the world's largest rainforest in captivity with steamy jungles and waterfalls and beautiful garden displays in Mediterranean and other world styles.

Look out for the view over the entire reserve from the car as you descend into the crater towards the garden.

After lunch at the Eden Project, drive back towards Exeter (driving time 2.5 hours excluding any stoppage time). Remember to take the route that takes you through the Dartmoor National Park. You can enjoy the moor landscape as you drive through - swathes of heather covered moorland, large granite tors and forested river valleys are all here. A nice stopover would be at Princetown which is on the way and has a nice Visitor centre where one can know about The Dartmoor Story.

DRIVING TIPS & INFORMATION

- > Make sure your headlights are in working order, as you will need them on all day due to mist/fog, which are common in the UK.
- > Roundabouts are quite abundant, hence, stay in your lane and give way to the right traffic on the roundabout.
- > Do not proceed on amber or red traffic lights and there are no free left turns.
- > Be aware of U-Turners. Drivers are permitted to execute a u-turn or a 3-point turn on any UK road unless it's expressly forbidden.
- > Road enthusiasts can get loads of info about UK roads, history including chat forums at www.sabre-roads.org.uk.
