Self-drive Tips

Toll Pass – An E-toll Pass is recommended for use by visitors to Sydney. Alternatively, you may get the Hertz Toll Day Pass.

Obstacles on the Road – Take note of wildlife road signs warning motorists of the dangers of wandering native Australian animals (wallabies, wombats, emus, etc.), especially at dawn and at dusk.

Fuel Stops – You should plan ahead for fuel stops. Some petrol stations do not operate around the clock and have limited credit card facilities.

Self-drive Tips

Road Rules – In Victoria, the speed limit on the open road rises to 100 kilometres per hour (km/h) and, in some sections of freeway, 110 km/h.

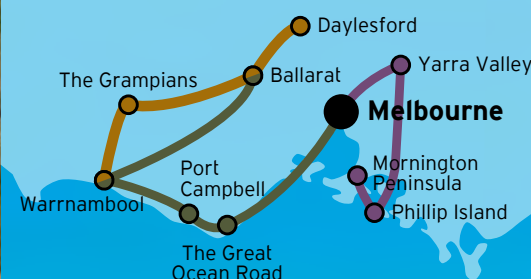
Hook Turns – The hook turn is an unusual road rule specific to Melbourne. To ensure that trams get a clear way through some intersections, drivers turning right must do so from the left-hand lane.

Trams – Cars must always stop behind a tram when it is stationary and the doors are open for passengers getting on or off the tram.

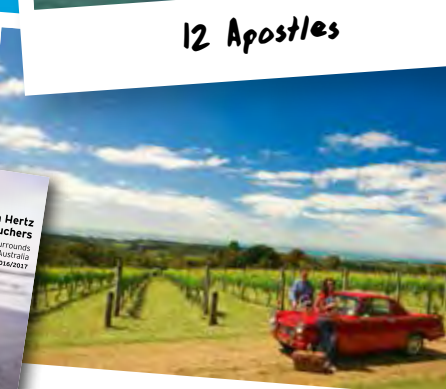

All car occupants must wear seat belts at all times and always carry a current road map or a reliable navigating system.

Beware of Animals on the Road – Australian wildlife and livestock often graze on the roadside and can stray onto the road. Be very careful when driving at sunrise, sunset and at night, when kangaroos and other animals are most active.

Specific Road Rules – Fraser Island has specific road rules, especially for four wheel drive (4WD) vehicles.

Self-drive Tips

Speed limits vary across the State. Major metropolitan arterial roads are generally capped at 60 kilometres per hour while suburban streets are almost exclusively limited to 50 km/h. Freeways and highways vary from 80 km/h to 110 km/h.

Road Conditions – Western Australia experiences heavy rains and cyclones that create flooding and sometimes destroy crossings. Some Western Australian roads are subject to flash flooding. Check the depth, force of the water and look for submerged objects before crossing.

Tasmania's network of highways allows drivers to loop around the island discovering an ever-changing landscape, but please allow several days driving – it's bigger than you think.

Drivers are reminded to fill up their tank if they are travelling long distances off the main routes, to or from the West Coast, or to the far south – particularly if driving after 6pm.

Tasmania has a small population and there are very few freeways however the two-lane roads are well-maintained and the traffic is light.

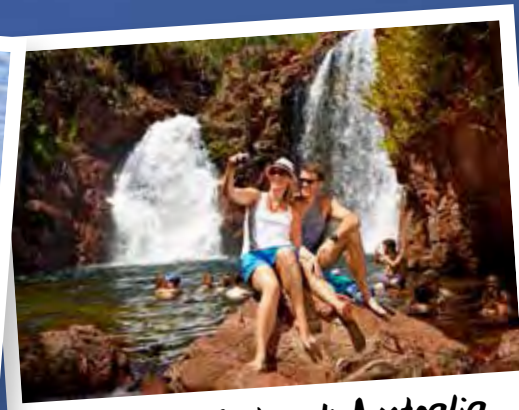

Self-drive Tips

Travelling around the Northern Territory by car gives you freedom, flexibility, and with the right vehicle, access all areas. It's the best way to get off the beaten track and explore the Territory's remote wilderness, at your own pace. It's not all off-road ruggedness, though as 95% of the Northern Territory's attractions are accessible by sealed highways.

Make sure your vehicle is in good working order. Try to avoid driving at night, and be wary of road trains and crossing stock on highways. Distances in the Northern Territory are vast, so plan ahead for rest stops.

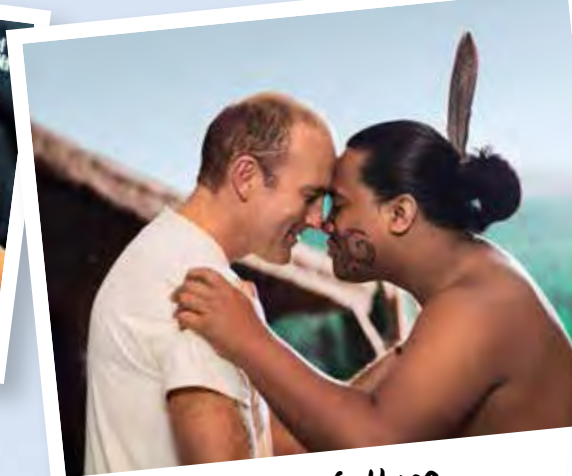

Self-drive Tips

To see the best of New Zealand, explore both the North and South Islands which are separated by Cook Strait. A regular inter-island ferry service connects the two islands between Picton and Wellington, so it is easy to leave your vehicle and collect another when travelling inter-island.

There is only one toll road in New Zealand, located North of Auckland between Silverdale and Puhoi, called the Northern gateway toll road.

In winter, some roads may be treacherous due to ice or snow, particularly around mountain passes. Look out for signs indicating slippery surfaces in winter and drive slowly. In some cases, chains may be required. Make sure you're familiar with how to fit them.

Self-drive Tips

Britain is made up of 4 countries, England, Scotland, Northern Ireland and Wales. Driving is on left side of the road as opposed to the rest of Europe.

Take note if you plan to drive to France from the UK via the Eurotunnel.

There is a congestion charge in London between 7 am to 6 pm on Mondays to Fridays. Parking is not allowed along roads with red and yellow lines except single yellow lines where parking is restricted.

The speed limit on motorways is 112 kilometres per hour (km/h) and 48km/h in built-up areas.

Self-drive Tips

France road network is well developed. There is almost 8,000 km of motorways and there is usually a toll for use. Autoroutes (Marked on signs with A) are Express highways for which you must pay tolls. Routes Nationales (Marked N) are National motorways for which there are no tolls, often with several lanes. Routes Departementales (Marked D) are smaller scenic country roads with less traffic.

International Driving Permit (IDP) is highly recommended for non-European drivers.

The place known for its big-city charms, romantic medieval castles and half-timbered towns.

Self-drive Tips

Germany has a fantastic road and highway network, especially the Autobahn that will connect you between all the major cities quickly and efficiently. The Autobahn do not have speed limits, unless otherwise marked. The recommended speed for Autobahn is 130 kilometres per hour (km/h).

You can only pass another car in the left lane. The right lane is for slower vehicles, and overtaking cars in the right lane is illegal.

Some areas of Germany have a time limit parking system, where a Parking Disc must be used. Carry some cash just in case as police in Germany will often collect fines on the spot. Be aware of Green zones where you can only enter if you have a valid low-emission disc.

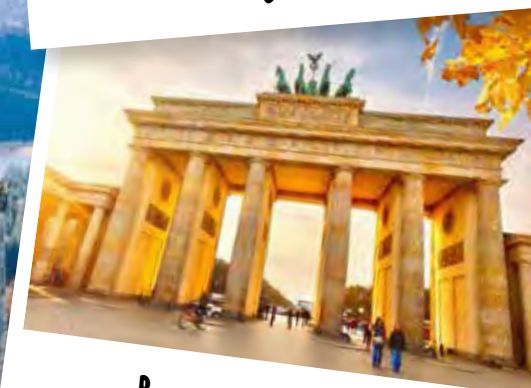

When driving on Highways and National roads, the dipped headlights must be used at all times (day and night). Apply for Telerent, a portable device for paying toll on the motorway without any queue.

Restricted Traffic Zone – Traffic is restricted in historical centres known as Zona a Traffico Limitato (ZTL) where entry is only permitted to registered vehicles (residents).

Driving in Switzerland is a dream come true for anyone who likes mountain routes with splendid vistas and well-maintained roadways. When driving on Autoroute, also called National Routes, an Autoroute vignette (Motorway tax sticker) is required. Glue it to your windshield so that it is visible for the police.

Taking car trains (Autoverlad) is quite common, convenient and congestion-free. Most of the time, you avoid a considerable detour and save travel time.

Make sure that you have adequate equipment for driving under winter conditions such as snow tires, snow chains, blankets and GPS system. Do check which mountain passes are closed during the winter months.

Finland is the 8th largest country in Europe, it is also the most sparsely populated country in the European Union. Expect to cover large distances, often through landscapes devoid of human habitation, especially in Lapland.

Traffic and Driving – Right-hand traffic and no road tolls. Headlights must be used at all times. Snow tires are obligatory from December to February. The speed limit is usually 50 km/h inside built-up areas, 80 km/h outside build-up areas and up to 120 km/h for motorways.

Parking – A vehicle may be stopped or parked only on the right hand side of a road (except on a one way road).

Speed limits are posted in miles-per-hour (mph). Generally, the speed limit on multi-lane freeways is 65mph. On two-lane highways it is usually 55 mph. The speed limit on city streets is usually 35mph.

Roundabouts are uncommon in California. Most intersections are either signed by traffic lights or by stop signs. Unless signed otherwise, it is legal to make a right turn on a red light after you come to a complete stop.

Speed limits and Driving Safety – On interstate highways, the speed limit is sometimes raised to 75mph. Unless otherwise posted, the speed limit is generally 55mph on highways and 25mph in cities. By Nevada law, wipers must be on while driving in rain or snow. Listen to the radio for changes in weather conditions.

Flashing yellow arrow turn signals – The flashing yellow arrows will replace the existing green left-hand turn signals at certain signalized intersections across the state. When on, yield to oncoming traffic and pedestrians before cautiously enter an intersection indicated by the arrow.

Discover the Nevada scenic byways – There are 20 scenic byways in Nevada comprising a total of 420 miles.

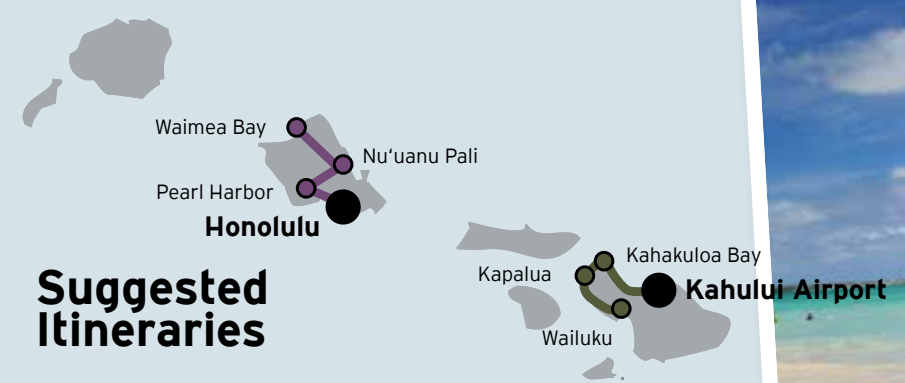

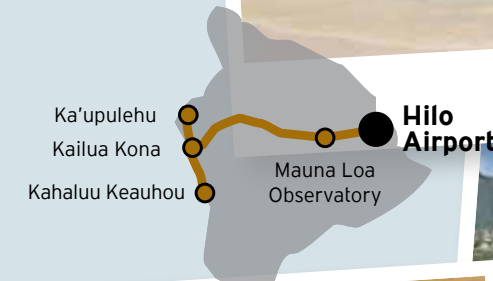

Car Seat Regulations – Every car driven on Florida roads must provide for the protection of any child, 5 years of age or younger, by using a federally approved car seat.

Right-of-way – No one has the right-of-way in Florida. The law only says who must yield (give up) the right-of-way. Every driver must do everything possible to avoid a crash.

Canada is the world's second-largest country at 9.98 million square kilometres in total. Its highway system includes the Trans-Canada Highway, which will take you from coast to coast.

Driving in Canada is similar to driving in USA but with a few differences. The distances and speeds are posted in kilometers, with maximum speed limit in Canada is 50 kilometres per hour (km/h) in cities, 80 km/h on highways, and 100 km/h on rural highways. Be cautious of deer, elk and moose while driving at night in rural areas.

Do note that some signs, particularly in Québec, may be in French, and right turns on red lights are permitted in most cities except certain areas of Québec.

My 2-Day Jeju Island Adventure in South Korea

For our first trip, we travelled around using public transport and found ourselves getting lost, especially at night. Hence, for our second trip to Jeju Island, we decided to rent a car to make our road trip a more fulfilling and relaxing one.

After a short 1 hour domestic flight to Jeju airport from Seoul, we went straight to the Hertz counter desk located next to gate #2 on arrival level with our reservation number.

After this, we took the free shuttle bus which is about 15 minutes-drive away to Jeju Auto house to collect our car.

Once we were there, there was just a 10 minutes verification of documents before we were given an orientation on the car as well as the GPS, which we have requested beforehand to be in

English, and we are ready to set off! Jeju Island is not as small as we see on the map! The airport is located at the north of the island and it is where the Jeju city is, so we stayed in an airbnb near to the airport.

We drove to our first spot - the Jeju Mysterious Road known for objects and liquid appearing to roll and flow up the hill instead of down. At the start point, we stopped our car, put it on neutral gear with hazard lights on, and witnessed ourselves move forward towards the ending point about 300 metres ahead. There was at least 6 cars queuing up to do the

same thing! The last stop before we retire for the night was dinner and some shopping at Jeju city.

Tips for driving in Jeju Island

- Always book your car in advance
- Google map do not work well in Jeju, hence, having a GPS is important (specifically request for English version during reservation). To use the GPS, you will need to input the last 7 digits telephone number of the destinations.
- Do check with the staff to create bookmarks or put pins to your hotel and rental office on your GPS Permit, if necessary.
- Even though Jeju is an island, factor in more travel time between your destinations as it may take you a couple of hours to travel from point to the other.

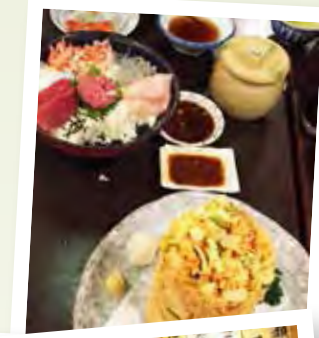

1. Shizuoka Prefecture Road Trip (5-7 September 2015)

My wife, Mei and I had a couple of places we wanted to visit in Central Tokyo and Shizuoka but for Shizuoka, rails are not getting us any nearer, so we decided that a 2-day road trip would be more convenient yet economical!



We picked up our car at Ofuna Station, Kanagawa which is the tail end of our Narita Express (nearest to Shizuoka). Rail rides are comfortable but mind you, there are no escalators and lifts in some of these stations!

We didn't want to drive more than two hours on the road, especially at night, on our first road trip in Japan - so we booked an Airbnb accommodation at a nearby town: Yugawara.

Shizuoka is renowned for its hot springs and we enjoyed a relaxing, authentic onsen experience at Atami. We also visited the Atami Castle, perched high on a hill with a great unblocked view of neighbouring towns.

Our favourite activity was participating in an hour long tofu making session (conducted 100% in Japanese) at a traditional tofu factory. We pre-arranged with Izu City Tourism Information Centre in Singapore.

Other places of interests includes Numazu Port



(fresh seafood) and Izu Fruits Park (fruits picking).

Although we missed out on locating the Daibutsu Buddha, we found a lively Odawara station and was fascinated with our first Japanese beautifully hand-crafted coffee and snacks at a local café.

Do take note that weather can be pretty wet and chilly at this time of the year (September), near the coastal areas in Shizuoka.



2. Osaka Multi-Prefecture Road Trip (14-20 April 2016)

April is spring time in Japan. We were hopeful to catch the famed cherry blossoms. We even stopped randomly by a few roads just to be up and close with them!

We utilized the highway extensively and chalked up impressive toll charges (JPY 18,910). It saved us lots of time. In some districts, we had to tread cautiously through narrow and two-way, one-lane streets.

We conquered several landmarks: Kuwana's Mitsui Outlet Park (shopping), Kyoto's Fushimi Inari

(sightseeing/hiking), Nagoya's Toyota Techno Museum (education), Shiga's Blumen Hugel Farm (sightseeing/flora) including Wakayama's Isonoura beach (chill out at the face of the vast Pacific Ocean).

To make amends from missing out on Daibutsu, this time, we made it a point to spend a night at Nara to visit the majestic Todai-shi. A UNESCO World Heritage site. Here, you have deers roam free and you feel a sense of peace and tranquility.

As a traveller, the experience had been breath-taking and dramatically enriched, especially in such a culturally rich country like Japan. There are many hidden gems.



Tips for driving in Japan

- You can truly immerse in the Japanese culture as your car navigates around small streets, snacking a bit, crossing long stretches of highways and stopping at a convenient few, across the prefectures. Each highway stops showcase unique snacks and gift; and parking is convenient.
- Cater more time for expected slower traffic in city centre (try to avoid morning and evening peak hours) and around touristy spots. Watch out for really narrow, single-lane meant for two-way traffic.
- Do advance reservation for your preferred car groups
- GPS is important (you can request for English version) and always double check the telephone number of your intended destination. You can also assistance from the rental car counter staff.
- Data-enabled smart phone or mobile routers are great secondary companion but data roaming may fade out in the mountainous regions and thick forestry.
- If you are frequenting the highways, remember to request for ETC (paying toll charges automatically instead of cash).



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
